Last week Lin Alford reminded us of the need to "count our blessings". Since then I've been thinking about the importance of thankfulness and gratitude, particularly at a time like this.

I remember reading an article by John Piper, where he describes gratitude as "the essential guardian of the soul". He quoted Romans 1:21, "Although they knew God, they did not glorify him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking and their senseless minds were darkened." In other words, if our minds are not filled with thankfulness or gratitude, then they will very likely get filled with other, futile things: excessive worry, complaining, grumbling or worse. When my mind is filled with gratitude for what God has done in my life, there is no room for such things.

The theme of thankfulness continues in Colossians 4:2, "Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful". The literal meaning of this verse is something like, "Be watchful in prayer <u>BY</u> thanksgiving". The Bible talks about being watchful in terms of a watchman on the city wall looking out for the attacks of the enemy. Have you ever thought of thankfulness as a weapon against the attacks of Satan? Being thankful keeps us alert, it focuses our mind, or fixes our attention on Christ and what he's done for us. It guards our minds from any onslaughts from Satan.

Do we make thankfulness, or "counting our blessings" a part of everyday life? Is it part of our prayer life? If not, then there is no better time to start than right now, when Satan wants to fill your mind with futile stuff.

The New Testament is filled with the call to be thankful: Colossians 3:15 - Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. Colossians 3:17 - And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Philippians 4:6 - Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 1 Thessalonians 5:18 - Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.
