JESUS helped his disciples understand who he was by giving them pictures they could relate to. We are exploring these great **'I AM'** statements of Jesus in our video talks.

These days, the only thing that seems certain is that things will remain uncertain for some time to come! The government may have given us a "roadmap" as to when things will begin to get "back to normal," but even this is fraught with uncertainty.

Living with such uncertainly can be very hard, especially if you suffer from impatience like me. We want our politicians to tell us when we can start to go on holiday, have a meal at a restaurant or more importantly, when we can start our church services again. But of course, nobody has the definitive answers to these questions. We just don't know!

However, as Christians, even in times of great uncertainty our faith enables us to have confidence. As Hebrews 11:1 says, "Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." What follows in chapter 11 is a list of some extraordinary exploits carried out by the men and women of the Old Testament. For these people, their confidence wasn't to be found in themselves or in their abilities, but in their God. They were ordinary people who put their confidence in an extraordinary God. They may have had their uncertainties about the future, but they had certainty in their God.

The apostle Paul also shared their confidence. In Philippians 1:6 he says, "I am <u>certain</u> that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns". In all the uncertainties of life, God is at work. Best of all, he's at work in our lives and he's not going to give up.

One of my heroines is a lady called Elisabeth Elliot. After her husband Jim and four of his companions were killed on a riverbank in the jungle of Ecuador, she returned to the very people who had taken his life and began sharing the Good News of Jesus with them. Things were very uncertain as she walked into the jungle, but she also had that same confidence in God, believing that Jim hadn't died in vain and God was still at work. After several years of working with these people, Elizabeth was to witness two of her husband's killers baptise the grandchildren of another missionary who had been killed with Jim. As she says in one of her books, "Of one thing I am perfectly sure: God's story never ends with ashes."


